The striking gray or roan filly stalked from just off the pace for most of the race until taking command at the top of the stretch and drawing away for a 1 ½ length score. ## A Word from Terry

Summer has arrived, and the heat and humidity have come in full force. Sale yearlings are now turned out late in the evening to avoid the hot sun and maintain their shining coats. Fans are on stalls to circulate the air in the barns and keep things cooler.

Sale season starts at Fasig-Tipton here in July. The farm consignment has two nice fillies that will sell Tuesday, July 13<sup>th</sup>. Hip #59 is a filly by the first-crop sire McCracken. She is a half-sister to four black type horses, including current three-year-old Kartano, who has an earnings update since the catalog. Hip #330 is a filly by Munnings. She is the first foal out of a Galileo line mare. This is the family of Firing Line and Sharp Azteca. The Endeavor consignment will be located in Barn 3, so please come and inspect the group.

July is also nomination month; foals can be Breeders' Cup nominated and mares will be nominated to the KBIF (breeders awards). I will contact you about your wishes for foals and mares. The fees are \$400 for the Breeders' Cup and \$60 for the KBIF.

Around the farm there is always something happening. The University of Kentucky Pasture Program just spent about a week on the property doing the yearly pasture analysis and we should have results and recommendations soon. I can tell you that doing the pasture mowing recently, the time and effort put in to follow UK's program has yielded great results. Our pastures have never looked better. Also, on the farm we are about to undertake a large fencing project. Over the next year or so our goal is to replace much of the current fence with new fencing to improve the safety and looks of the farm.
