Brit's Wit Weaves Through Traffic to Break Maiden First Time Out

Brit's Wit got an education and then some in a gutsy winning effort in his first career race at Indiana Grand. Off slow after hesitating at the start, the two-year-old son of English Channel didn't get in a hurry and settled in the back, saving ground on the rail. A rapid move down the stretch appeared to have him stuck behind traffic. Darting through an impossibly narrow gap, Brit's Wit somehow found a way through his foes and scurried off under a hand ride to win first ask. After that sort of perseverance, he should be prepared to handle just about anything! Brit's Wit was foaled and raised at Endeavor Farm and was bred by John Kuehl's Willow Lane Stables. He is out of longtime farm resident Secret Humor (by Yes It's True) and is her seventh winner to date. She is currently in foal to Global Campaign. Endeavor Sales consigned Brit's Wit last October at Fasig-Tipton, where he was purchased for \$30,000 by his current ownership group, Iroquois Racing Club. Congrats to John Kuehl for breeding yet another winner, and a great job by all connections involved, including jockey Jermaine Bridgmohan and trainer Andrew McKeever. Best of luck moving forward with this talented horse!



Impressive 6 1/2 Length Allowance Score for Kartano

It's becoming apparent that Kartano (Tamarkuz – One for You, by Dayjur) always shows up well-prepared on race day, and he was as ready as ever when running in allowance conditions at Colonial Downs on August 30th. Off as the post-time favorite at odds of 1/2, the chestnut gelding won going away for a 6 1/2 length margin of victory. This win makes his record 2-3-2 from 7 career starts, including a third-place finish in the English Channel Stakes at Gulfstream Park. Kartano was foaled and raised at Endeavor Farm for breeder Coal Creek Farm. He was consigned at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton July sale for \$37,000. Way to go!

The racing scene for Endeavor Farm and horses raised at the farm was successful beyond expectations in August. Endeavor Farm and Caveman Stable bred stakes winner Bee Extravagant, who won the Inaugural Stakes at Arapahoe Park. Endeavor also bred Pranked, who ran second in the Molly Brown Stakes, also at Arapahoe Park. Endeavor Sales graduates also had a big month. Brit’s Wit won in his first start at Indiana Grand. This guy worked his way through the field to score impressively in maiden special company on the turf. Brit’s Wit was bred by John Kuehl’s Willow Lane Stable and was a sales graduate last October at the Fasig-Tipton yearling sale. Kartano was a Fasig-Tipton July 2019 sale yearling. He was bred by Coal Creek Farm and has been very consistent thus far in his career. He just won by 6 lengths at Colonial Downs and has yet to finish off the board. There were many other winners this month and we congratulate all of the connections.

The September consignment will be the next chance to grab a winner. Unfortunately, we have had a couple of scratches, but there is still a filly by Lord Nelson selling on Monday the 20th out of Book 4. Please stop by barn 35 to inspect her. She is a half-sister to the previously mentioned filly Pranked. The sales consignment then shifts back to October at Fasig-Tipton where four yearlings will be offered. At the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale we will have 14 in our consignment with a mix of mares and weanlings. We are very excited to represent you and to present these horses to the public.
